Dr Talwalkar after completing his MD and Nephrology training at the prestigious KEM hospital in Mumbai came to Bangalore in 1979 and single handedly started the dialysis and renal services of the erstwhile Bangalore Kidney Foundation. He can truly be considered the parent of Karnataka Nephrology. Over the last 3decades Dr Talwalkar earned a reputation of not only being an excellent Nephrologist but also as a humane and kind doctor. For us colleagues he was truly a leader and father figure. He declined many awards and posts in societies and was a humble soul who strived hard to help his patients. Petsonally in his passing away I have lost a true friend and guide as he inspired me to take up Nephrology in early 80 and made me go to Vellore for my training.

disease among the public. Educating herself from Dr. Georgi Abraham and Dr. Sutesh sankarasubbiyan, Nephrologist, Sundaram medical foundation chennai, she has prepared a Comprehensive power point presentation on kidney



disease- its causes, symptoms, management and prevention \*both in English and Tamil. She talks to high school children, college students and working men and women and also to the general public at Large. She has prepared posters and hand-bills containing information on this matter. She sticks posters in places where the programs are given and distribute the hand-bills to the audience including the students. She requests them to pass on the hand-bills to their parents, relatives and other elders. At the end of the program she holds an interaction session with the audience and clears their doubts.

She feels that she should reach out to the under privileged individuals including students and their parents who do not have correct information about kidney disease and the available medical care. She acquired permission from Educational officer, Corporation of Chennai and conducted this program in high and higher secondary schools in corporation Zones I, II and III. Starting from .11 march 2005, when she did her first awareness program in Illalur village, 60km in south of chennai for the students of Government school, Mrs Rajalakshmi Ravi has done...
